On Health Care, Congress Races Against Recess Deadline

Congressional leaders this week are racing against the clock in hopes of making at least some progress in advancing major health care legislation before the summer recess. A small group of bipartisan senators on the Senate Finance Committee, led by the chairman, Max Baucus, Democrat of Montana, hope finally to reach a deal on health care legislation that would let them issue a draft bill and begin committee sessions a week from Monday, with a goal of completing the bill before the Senate leaves town on Aug. 8. **Full article available.**

Wider Employer-Provided Coverage Projected Under House Plan

The Congressional Budget Office, answering questions by Republican critics of the health care legislation proposed by House Democrats, said on Sunday that the bill would drive 9 million people off of employer-provided insurance plans but that 12 million people who do not have such coverage now would get it at a net increase of 3 million people insured through their employers by 2016.

Depression Poses Pregnancy Risks

Many women know that after they give birth they are at risk for postpartum depression, and that seeking treatment can improve their life and their relationship with their new baby. Depression during pregnancy, however, does not get as much publicity, but new research shows it can actually have a negative effect on a woman's unborn baby. Depression during pregnancy is fairly common—an estimated 20% of pregnant women have symptoms of major depression, while still more have depressive symptoms (bothersome and unhealthy feelings that don't quite qualify as clinical depression). In a recent study, researchers discovered that women with depressive symptoms during their pregnancy had nearly twice the risk of delivering their baby early (before 37 weeks). Early delivery is the number one cause of infant mortality, and also raises other health risks for the newborn. However, the safety of antidepressants during pregnancy is still up for debate, and there has been no comprehensive comparison on the safety of various antidepressants in pregnancy. Currently, experts advise that pregnant women suffering from depression be treated on a case-by-case basis, depending on the extent of their symptoms. Ultimately, a healthy mother is more likely to give birth to a healthy child.

Standards Might Rise on Monitors for Diabetics

The more than 11 million diabetics in the US may be dismayed to learn that the home glucose monitors they rely on each day follow international standards that allow the monitors to be wrong by as much as 20%. This error rate is so great that it leaves patients vulnerable to severe complications, such as seizures, loss of consciousness, and comas. The US FDA is finally taking action on this matter, and last month pressed the International Organization for Standardization, the international group that sets the standards for glucose monitors, amongst other things, to tighten the rules. A tightening of the

international standards would be the easiest option, but if the organization fails to respond, the FDA can begin a cumbersome process of tightening the rules in the US. A number of studies have found that results from home monitors can vary greater than 30%. While all of these monitors still comply with the loose regulations currently in place, the manufacturers will be forced to make a better and more accurate product if the FDA is successful at influencing a tightening of the standards.

Kids' Lower IQ Scores Linked to Prenatal Pollution

A study conducted in New York City has found that exposure to air pollution before birth is linked to lower childhood IQ scores. The results of this study bolster evidence that smog is capable of damaging a developing brain. The pregnant women involved in the study, who wore backpack air monitors for 48 hours each, lived mostly in low-income areas in northern Manhattan and the South Bronx. They were exposed to typical types of urban pollution, generally emanating from car, bus, and truck exhaust. The children born to these women were then given IQ tests at age 5, before starting school. The children who were exposed to the highest levels of pollution in utero scored an average of 4 to 5 points lower on their IQ test than children with lower levels of pollution exposure. According to the study's authors, a 4 to 5 point difference in IQ is significant enough to affect a child's performance in school. This knowledge that prenatal pollution exposure can affect a child's IQ may help explain why low-income children often do worse academically than children from middle-and upper-class homes, as low-income families are more likely to live in areas with more pollution.
