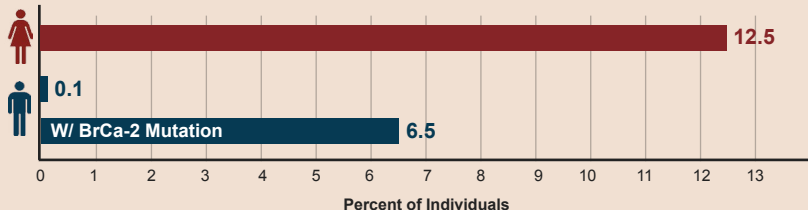


## LIFETIME PREVALENCE

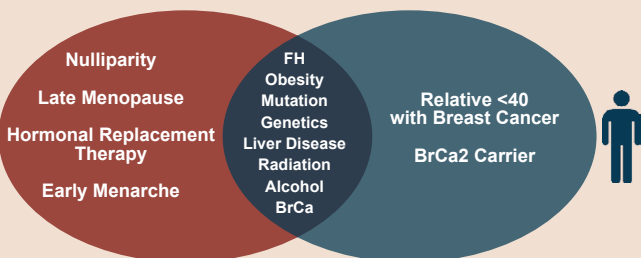
Breast Cancer Lifetime Prevalence



## RISK FACTORS

### Factors which lower risk for women

- » Multiparity
- » Late Pregnancy
- » Breastfeeding
- » Early Menarche
- » Oral Contraceptives



## SCREENINGS

- » Recommendations vary
- » If risk >20% annual mammogram with MRI



- » Guidelines not clear
- » Exam is more accurate than x-ray



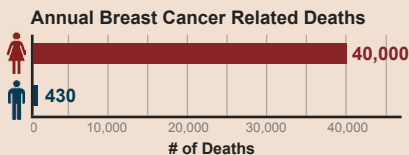
## TREATMENT

- » Treatment is usually the same for both sexes, and may include:
  - » Chemotherapy
  - » Surgery (lumpectomy vs mastectomy)
  - » Radiation (if high grade tumor or positive sentinel node)
  - » Anti-Hormone Therapy
    - » If Estrogen Receptor+ or Progesterone Receptor+



## SURVIVAL

- » Survival rates are equal for men and women after treatment
- » Most powerful predictor of outcome is status of sentinel axillary nodes



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
